



11/9/2016 Ho'oikaika Partners Meeting Minutes

Location: UHMC, Ka'aike Building, Room 210

FCJC: Toy drive held on 10/29, sponsored by realtors and Old Republic. Partnered with United Way as they weren't able to fulfill all requests.

MPD: Kalo program is in swing. Iao Valley is still closed, therefore program is held at Hawaiian Island Land Trust property. Just over 20 kids in POI which is a very positive number and higher than normal. At least 10 parents coming in with their children.

Early Childhood Comprehensive Systems Maui Impact (ECCS Maui Impact): federal Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) has selected Hawaii's ECCS Maui Impact grant as one of the 12 HRSA grantees. Focus is on island of Maui to show a 25 percent increase in age appropriate developmental skills among community's three (3) year old children within five years. Hawaii will use collective impact approach to work with Maui County Early Childhood Resource Coordinator, Partners In Development – Tutu and Me Program and Maui Family Support Services and other agencies and initiatives to drive systems change. Starts in July 2017. This is a new theory of change to see if using a two-generation approach and working simultaneously on three levels – community, county and state – can demonstrate improved outcomes in Maui. DOH: one of the priorities/initiatives is investing in healthy babies and healthy families. Go to website for DOH for additional info.

PACT: Received grant from DHS for Lanai and Ulupuna

Action Strategy: internally testing out Keiki Central mobile friendly website, rolling out to WIC counselors for a month, launching to public in Feb 2017. Need agencies to fill out one form per program, not just per agency.

PATCH: bringing training to Molokai and has already generated a lot of interest from our Molokai Coalition with a wait list. Would like to set-up Hana training next month. Will reach out to Stacey at Women Helping Women and Malama.

John: spoke about Protective Factors at Diocese convention. John is one of the trainers and has conducted training for 9 years. Paul will f/u and email John about possibly using a PF trainer for diocese. Best time is on Saturdays per John. Ho'oikaika can provide lunch.

Catholic Charities: Sarah Begley is the supervisor and will be attending monthly meetings until Anella's position is filled. End of funding for Catholic Charities.

Update from Molokai Coalition meeting on November 3: Molokai Resource Directory will be added to website soon. Molokai is going strong and strong interest in collaboration. 25 travel scholarships were awarded to Molokai recipients. Habitat for Humanity has joined Molokai. Would like youth speaker from LGBTQ community to participate at next year's conference. FCJC funding a high-risk pilot training called Journey A New Beginning.

Feedback from October 21 Protective Factors Conference: Overall feedback was very positive from agencies. Would like to learn more about resources on Maui. Breakout rooms at venue for next year? Find 30-45 minutes during conference to do a mini-resource fair. Brief presentations from people? Discuss at next Core meeting. Increase attendance from faith community. Possibly have Joh speak at next year's conference. Conference breakdown: 194 registered attendees – 187 attended, 7 no-shows 148 Evaluations collected – most attendees checked Strongly Agree in all categories. 145 Pre and Post Tests collected – 80 responded it was their 1st conference, 49 responded it was their 2nd conference, 11 responded it was their 3rd conference and 5 did not respond. Feedback was mainly very positive on a well-organized and inspiring conference, almost all loved Dr. Kimo Alameda and Kholby on evaluations. Afternoon snacks were appreciated. Constructive feedback on sound being too loud for a few folks sitting in front who asked Zeke to lower volume; lighting from skylight and outside was sometimes too bright to see screen; too many panel members and not enough time for Q&A, too many people sitting at each table as seemed too crowded, some folks did not like assigned seating and some folks liked it, lower energy level from panel members and a few panel members spoke too long.

Possible speakers for next year's conference: LGBTQ, faith community (John), resource caregivers (male and female), Kimo again. Create panel of community members, instilling PF from the community. Limit panel to 3 or 4 members.

Planning for April CAN activities: Paul will check with Edel on grant for Ho'oikaika as current grant expires on 2/28/2017. 3 year grant should be coming out this month. Uncle Wayne tour and include Molokai and Lanai this year. Ashley will reach out to Uncle Wayne. Insert ad FCJC supplement. Karen and John will collaborate and write an op-ed together. Deadline for submittal is March 1. Possible collaboration with priests in April for CAN is for them to consider preaching

CAN on a Sunday and we will provide them talking points. Paul will email John to f/u. Suggestions for day of event: involve more of community, put signs/banners up so folks driving by can see and attend. Make 3 banners to post at various locations. Have volunteers help sign wave to recruit people to attend.
