Jeny – brought Colgate toothbrushes, emphasized importance of oral health in Maui County. Access problem in Maui County as where do Medicare and Underinsured go for oral health needs? New dentist at Hui. Dr. Gupta is go-to person. Long waiting list for Community Clinic. Last option is fly to Oahu.

Michelle – Proclamation for drug courts is on Thursday, May 5 at 1:30pm as part of Maui Drug Court Celebration at County Courthouse.

Tina – Project Laulima Cross-System Training being offered on Maui: an email was sent out to those interested. Please respond to email for training.

Karen – update on Action Strategy. Request to present at May Partners meeting. Completed 2 year round of objectives and strategies and looking to create next set. Funding for neighbor travel to Oahu. Team 2 is focused on safe and nurturing families and expanding PF use...comprehensive campaign of family violence protection, consist of training on how to have conversation in families on family violence. Childcare providers see this but have no training or experience with this, how does one bring up topic?

Shannon – Saturday, June 18<sup>th</sup> from 1pm-5pm at UHMC great lawn. Celebration of Father's Event. Will forward me flyer for distribution to everyone.

Jeny – FREE Substance Abuse Training on Friday, May 27 at UH Kalama 103. Limited seating as room is small. Trainer is Dr. Ira Chasnoff, pediatrician from Big Island. Jeny is working on flyer and will distribute in the next week or so.

Willow – Hope Chapel Youth Ministry. Received 2 Mandated Reporter DVDs. Ashley spoke with Kyle at Hope Chapel and he was going to have Toni call to follow-up. Willow will follow-up with Toni when she drops off DVDs and have her call Ashley to schedule training with Youth Ministry. Jeny suggested we should have CWS at training also.

Kawewehi – shared positive feedback from last year’s October PF conference. Kalo program using PF and add to curriculum. Shared with group that PF training made an impact, lots of folks learned a lot. Asked him to email testimonial to Ashley to include in our next grant report as meets grant deliverable.

**Debrief Mayor’s Proclamation** – Michelle loved our photo in April newsletter. More kids than last year and kids were dancing and having fun. Around 200 kids were in attendance. Need to get more community members involved and attend this event next year. Weekday is difficult. Wooden pinwheels need more sparkle and need to look more 3-dimensional. Some markings need to match as base doesn’t match poles. Scrambling on Monday morning. Have preschools RSVP far in advance next year, not last-minute or a few days before proclamation. Perhaps make Proclamation a part of Keiki Fest next year? It is on a Saturday and Keiki Fest is well-attended. Try to partner with Keiki Fest folks, sponsored by Kiwanis Club. Will add to Core Partners Agenda for discussion at next Core Partners meeting.

**Planning for October PF Conference on Friday, October 21, 2016** – Dr. Kimo Alameida: Ashley will follow-up to coordinate logistics. Target for audience: direct service providers and testimony from youth who has benefited from Partnership. Dr. Alameida will wrap it all up. Culturally meaningful to population we serve, no matter who we are serving. Expertise is “local style”, not so much Hawaiian. PF is western model. Dr. Alameida will tie it all together from his cultural perspective.

Suggestions from group: Q&A afterwards with Dr. Alameida for folks who need to or would like to stay after the program ends around 2:30pm? Keep audience engaged. Offer CEUs. State workers have to stay or go somewhere else. Working lunch speaker was not well-received last year. Networking during lunch? Assigned seating? Don’t sit with same people you know. Consider team building activity or exercise just for government workers and anybody who would like to stay....look at evaluations from last year and draw from that. Have small group areas set-up for networking? Have informational tables...help clients connect. Have a table for each of the 5 Protective Factors for folks who would like more information on each PF. Have 5 tables. Parent Line booklets are very helpful from Bob as they had one brochure for each PF. Supposed to distribute statewide. Jeny can obtain from CFS Oahu. Jeny will request for 250 brochures from CFS Oahu. Folks will email Ashley if any other ideas or suggestions for October PF conference.
