Welcome, Introductions, Organization Announcements:

Marcial Pualani Basbas is from Child and Family Service and is the Parent Partner their 'Ohana Support Services Program. The Parent Partner assists parents of youth receiving services from the Maui Family Guidance Center.

Karen Worthington: Presentation on behalf of Action Strategy Safe and Nurturing Families Team Family Violence Prevention campaign. Karen presented on the history and development of Action Strategy from Jan. 2012 to today. This is a private-public partnership with over 100 members.

The Overarching Outcomes are: 1) Children are born healthy; 2) Children's health and development are on-track; 3) Children are ready for school when they enter kindergarten; and 4) Children are proficient learners by third grade.

The Focus Areas are: 1) Healthy and Welcomed Births; 2) Safe and Nurturing Families; 3) On-track Health and Development; 4) Equitable Access to Programs and Services; 5) High-Quality Early Learning Programs; and 6) Alignment and transition Support to K-3.

Karen shared the PSA campaign (print media - DRAFT) for Safe and Nurturing Families. The Family Violence Prevention Framework “Hau’oli ‘Ohana. HP members gave feedback on the (3) slides about: how comfortable we are using the message; will it resonate in our community; and what conversations will the PSA start?

The Front Porch Project® is also being considered as a “community-based primary prevention initiative based on the belief that everyone can and should become more aware of how to help and protect children and support families in their own community.” FPP is a research based training program and is an initiative out of Pennsylvania Family Support Alliance.
