Update on 20th annual CAN conference in Washington, DC: 3 days in DC, held every other year and themes were Building Community and Building Hope. Around 2,000 attendees. Jeny and Jackie Perry attended on behalf of Hawaii citizen panel. Reps from PCAH, CWS and DOH also were there. Building PF, building the arc and looking at social determinants of health were discussed. 3 issues to work on in terms of addressing determinants: DV prevention, substance abuse prevention and mental health. Family mentoring and peer support is critical to success. We cannot expect CWS to do it alone, unrealistic expectation. Better collaboration with DOE and vice versa. Collaborate with private partners and create meaningful partnerships to be able to build hope and build community. Prevention was other theme.

Molokai Chapter of Ho'oikaika Partnership meeting on September 1: putting together Resource Directory for Molokai. 3 DOE reps attend Molokai meetings: Will, Kimberly and Margaret. They will run their own meeting in October. 20 travel scholarships will be provided for Molokai and Lanai for October PF Conference.

Feedback from Project Laulima Cross-Systems Training on September 8: The interaction and engagement was excellent. The roving/moving charts was good. Assigned seats were helpful so folks can interact and meet new people from other agencies. Suggestion to do assigned seats for Oct PF conference. "One of the best trainings I've ever attended".

Continuation of Planning for October PF Conference: Deadline for agencies to include materials in packets is **Friday, October 7** end of business day at MFSS. Drop off quantity of 200 of agency materials to MFSS to attention of Edel. Otherwise you may bring quantity of 200 of your agency materials to our date of stuffing bags. **Date for stuffing bags is Friday, October 14 at 3:30pm at MFSS.** John Tomoso will be our moderator for the panel session and will help with NASW. Michele is helping with ADAD. Anella can help print black & white certificates of

attendance. Ask attendees what they would like to see at next year's conference and add a comment box in questionnaire. Will ask attendees how many Ho'oikaika conferences they have attended so far as this is our 3rd annual conference. Is this their 1st, 2nd or 3rd?

Registration lines moved a bit slow last year. Kevin will help as concierge to move folks along in line and expedite registration process. Separate table again for ADAD and NASW CEUs. Do not give out partial credit this year. To prevent no-shows, put a value on the conference to minimize folks not showing up.
